CONTEXTUAL INFORMATION

Salvado Catholic College is a new co-educational Catholic College that opened at the commencement of 2016.

Our Foundation Year had students from Kindergarten to Year 2. We also commenced a 3 Year Old Education Program and Playgroup in Semester 2. The College will continue to grow to reach its ultimate capacity as a K-12 College.

The Stage 1 building program has delivered a modern and purpose built early learning centre, junior primary classrooms, grassed and hard court play areas, enclosed assembly area, an administration building and car parks. The innovative building design has a focus on shared, flexible learning spaces which promotes collaborative teaching and learning approaches. In 2018, we will commence the Stage 2 Build to complete the Primary campus.

The College patron, Dom Rosendo Salvado was an inspirational missionary who founded the community of New Norcia. The College's motto "Peace, Justice, Compassion" directly reflects Salvado's life work and is our vision for Salvado Catholic College.

The Administration Officer manages the day to day attendance at the College. Absences are then followed up by classroom teachers.

If a child is absent, parents/carers are required to phone the Front Office or email by 9:00am to inform the College of the absence for that day. If a student is late to school (ie. arriving after 8:40am), the parent/carer must sign their child/ren in through the Administration building personally, and a Transit Card will be given to them to pass on to the classroom teacher. If a student is required to leave early, the parent/carer must sign their child/ren out and a Principal's Pass is given to them to pass on to the classroom teacher.

An SMS message is sent to parents/carers by 9:30am for all unexplained absences. Following the student's return to school, they are required to bring a note to their classroom teacher from their parents with the following information: date of absence and reason for absence.

NAPLAN ANNUAL ASSESSMENTS

Student Feedback

Students have indicated a strong sense of belonging and feeling safe in our Foundation Year at Salvado Catholic College. They have enjoyed the learning experiences and resources at Salvado Catholic College in their Learning Spaces, as well as being actively involved in the specialist classes offered at the College.

Parent Feedback

Salvado Catholic College is developing a very positive reputation within the Byford community and Parish of St Francis Xavier. At enrolment interviews, parents are speaking very positively of the reputation of the College. Parents have been given the opportunity to provide feedback on the following aspects:

Good News of Jesus Christ (Discipleship)

- There was positive feedback about the Religious Education lessons and the involvement of students in Prayer Services and Masses.
- The introduction of Salvado Day to celebrate the Patron of the College was well received by the whole College community.
- There were also positive comments made of the parent education of the Catholic faith via dissemination of information, particularly as we are a young school community.

Education & Learning (Learning)

- Overall, parents and carers were very happy with the curriculum offered to their children at Salvado Catholic College.
- They were very positive about the staff and the way that learning experienced engaged their children.
- Reporting and assessment practices that have been established have also been seen as a positive.

Working Together as a College Community (Engagement)

- Parents and carers all made the comment that they felt well informed from the College with the various communication channels used eg. emails, text messages, eCommunication and eNewsletters.
- There have been many opportunities for families to come together for community building events. Several comments were made about the strong community spirit that was already evident.

Stewardship of the Environment & Resources (Accountability)

The feedback in regards to the buildings and the actual Learning Spaces and the resources at Salvado Catholic College was very positive. Parents and carers were impressed with the facilities and resources that we already have at the College.

Parent support at Salvado Catholic College in our Foundation Year was very evident in the assistance given in the Learning Spaces, the participation of parents and carers on the Friends of Salvado committee and the many helpers in the various College community events held throughout the year.

Staff Feedback

Staff indicated in individual meetings, a real sense of team that included ownership, commitment and a great sense of accomplishment in our Foundation Year. All staff commented on the strong and positive culture that was being formed. We had a 100% staff retention rate and had several applicants for the teaching and non-teaching positions advertised for 2017. There have been several comments made by visitors to the College of the friendly and welcoming staff atmosphere that exists at Salvado Catholic College.
